The Bathurst Winter Festival was launched in July 2015 to coincide with the celebrations to mark the Bathurst Bicentenary.

Dam goes over 50 per cent capacity

RECENT rain in the region has seen Ben Chifley Dam record its highest level in almost 76 weeks.

On Tuesday, the city's main water storage registered 50.9 per cent, the first time it's been above 50 per cent since the start of 2019 and up 2.5 per cent from last Tuesday's reading.

As of August 11, there is also a green level alert in place for Ben Chifley Dam.

This means that water related recreational activities are now allowed on the dam.
